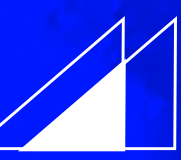

### TOUCH DOWN IN QUITO, EQUADOR AT CASA GANGOTENA HOTEL

Quito, nestled among those breathtaking Andean peaks, truly stands out as the world's second highest capital. It's got this vibe that's hard to beat, thanks to its stunning surroundings. Originally, the Quito tribe settled here in the first millennium, and it later became a key player in the Inca Empire until it was taken down and rebuilt by Sebastián de Benalcázar in 1534. The colonial center is a gem—UNESCO named it a World Heritage Site in 1978—and it's one of the biggest and best-preserved areas in Latin America. You'll find amazing museums, beautiful churches, and art galleries everywhere, making it a culture lover's paradise!

Here's a look at the epic lineup of islands and sites we'll explore: El Junco Lagoon, Post Office Bay, Baroness View Point, Punta Cormorant, Punta Suarez, Gardner Bay, Twin Craters, the Charles Darwin Research Station, Prince Philip's Steps, Darwin Bay, Rábida Island, Chinese Hat, Cerro Brujo, Isla Lobos, San Cristóbal Island, Floreana Island, Española Island, Santa Cruz Island, Puerto Ayora, Genovesa Island, and Sombrero Chino.



## OCOTBER 12 / DAY 10

### SAY GOODBYE TO NEW FRIENDS AND PREPARE FOR YOUR JOURNEY HOME

After breakfast this morning we'll visit The Gianni Arismendy Interpretation Center, San Cristóbal Island.

Dive into a conservation hub that brings the islands' wild story to life. Explore exhibits on the archipelago's volcanic birth, powerful ocean currents, unique climate, and the arrival of its legendary endemic species. The Human History wing walks you through dramatic moments of discovery and early colonization.

After this final adventure, you'll head to the San Cristóbal airport for your flight back to the mainland, then connect in Quito for your international journey home.

# GEARS

## APPAREL

**Lightweight natural fabrics; rainwear in subtropical areas. Warmer clothes are needed in upland areas. Make sure that you have good-quality, well-broken boots with plenty of ankle support for trekking or walking on uneven terrain.**

**It is not necessary to carry much to the Galapagos, pack light and pack smart. Lightweight fast drying cotton is recommended.**

**Light Jacket or Long Sleeved**

**Rain jacket**

**Cotton Pants**

**Shorts / T-Shirts**

**Sandals** or “Crocs” for wearing around yacht

**Hiking Boots / Walking sneakers**

**Sun Hat**

## EQUIPMENT

**Camera**

**Toiletries** (the basics i.e. toothbrush/facial products/sanitary wipes/moleskin for feet)

**Waterproof bag** for phones, cameras, etc.

## IMPORTANT

When purchasing a pair of hiking boots remember to get them a half size bigger.

You do not want them too snug. Most of the hiking isn't super strenuous, but you want the best fit.

Your feet swell when hiking and you have the extra thickness of your merino wool socks. This extra space allows your toes not to be smashed in to the front of your boot while going downhill resulting in black and blue toenails which are very painful.
